

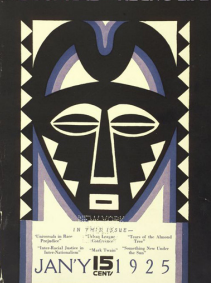

CONNECTING BLACK AMERICAN HISTORY TO THE GLOBAL BLACK EXPERIENCE

The 2nd Annual Schomburg Summer Education Institute will convene for 5 days to unite educators—school teachers, college faculty, community educators and college students—with premier historians and scholars to explore the history and cultures of African Americans and African peoples throughout the Diaspora. Participants will engage in dynamic learning experiences—lectures, interactive workshops, curator talks and community walks—that are connected to the Schomburg's current exhibitions, permanent collections, and vast digital resources. Educators will gain valuable content knowledge and learn inquiry-based approaches to teaching across the grades using the Schomburg's rich resources both on-site and on-line. Curriculum materials will be provided daily including primary and secondary resources, exhibition guides, bibliographies and sample activities.

Wednesday, July 27 *Black Manhattan: Renaissance and Contemporary Contexts*

Presentation topics include: Africans in Colonial New York; 19th Century Free Black Communities in New York: Seneca Village & Weeksville; Black Abolitionists: Sojourner Truth & Frederick Douglass; The Black West; Black Manhattan (19th, 20th, & 21st Centuries); The Harlem Renaissance; The Black Arts Movement and Beyond; Reconstructing the Civil Rights Timeline: Historical Intersections; The Women of SNCC; Race in Post-Civil Rights America; The Social Construction of Black Criminality; Africana Age: African & African Diasporan Transformations in the 20th Century; The African Diaspora in the Indian Ocean World; Contemporary Photographers Documenting the Global Black Experience; and more.
